## Channel swimmer swims for Radley Lakes

Fresh from his recent success at swimming the English Channel, Angus McChesney will swim the River Thames through Abingdon on Sunday to celebrate his success and to support the cause of *Save Radley Lakes*.

Not content with his gruelling 12¾ hour swim across the shipping lanes of the English Channel in August, when he collected over £40,000 in sponsorship for a leukaemia charity, Mr McChesney will swim on Sunday September 9<sup>th</sup> to help the well known local group, *Save Radley Lakes*, to persuade RWE npower not to fill Thrupp Lake at Radley with ash from Didcot power station. Mayor of Abingdon, Councillor Lorraine Oates, will “start the event” at 12.30 p.m. at Abingdon Lock. Towing a dinghy with eye-catching banners, Angus’ swim will proceed past Abbey Meadow, the Nag’s Head Pub, Abingdon Bridge, Abingdon Boat Centre, St Helen’s Church, ending at the Old Anchor Inn on St Helen’s Wharf. A collection will be made to support *Save Radley Lakes*’ Legal Fund. A competition (details on the day) will be held, with prizes.

Recently the power station management has been very successful with ash recycling, so much so that they recycled more than they produced last year, halving the amount of ash stockpiled at the power station. “*The thing I want to persuade the public and RWE npower is that it is no longer acceptable to throw recyclable ash into a lake,*” said Angus McChesney. “*If RWE ruin this lake, during the last few years operation by Didcot A, risking flooding and losing a much loved wildlife resource, they will be doing something which no other major power company in this country finds acceptable. RWE will lose face when people realise that their competitors, Powergen and Eon have policies to avoid such waste.*” Recycling ash at Didcot can save up to 250,000 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> each year, says *Save Radley Lakes*: disposing of it as landfill, wastes this opportunity.
